As part of this functional linguistic paradigm, genre theory is developed as an outline of how we use language to live; it tries to describe the ways in which we mobilize language - how out of all the things we might do with language, each culture chooses just a few, and enacts them over and over again - slowly adding to the repertoire as needs arise, and slowly dropping things that are not much use.

In SFL, then, genre represents systems of social processes that constitute a culture. From such a perspective, systems of genres are realised in configurations of register variables that are realised in patterns of choices in language (and other semiotic systems). Linguistic genre studies can be roughly divided into two schools, Systemic Functional Linguistics or "SFL", and English for Specific Purposes or "ESP." SFL scholars believe that language structure is an integral part of a text's social context and function. SFL scholars often conduct research that focuses on genres' usefulness in pedagogy.
