Pitirim Alexandrovich Sorokin was born in 1889 to a northern Russian rural craftsman's family, was early orphaned, secured a higher and graduate education through scholarships, was a young revolutionary in Czarist Russia, was repeatedly imprisoned, became Kerensky's secretary in the first post-Czarist government, survived the first few years of the Bolshevik regime in an academic life, and was then condemned to death and finally escaped into exile.

In 1924, before he became well-known in American academic circles, he published ‘Leaves of a Russian Diary’ (1924), a memoir that provided in-depth insights into the unraveling of the Russian monarchy and the subsequent rise of the ‘Bolsheviks.’ Years later, in 1950, he added an addendum to the book named ‘The Thirty Years After.’
